<p>Young World 4 Unit 3, Yesterday and today</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Phone Call</p> <p>Pupils write with the help of their notes about their last weekend a phone call. The teacher supports where necessary. The difference between the question forms in present and past will be discussed. Each student gets a question in present or past and has to find his/her partner who has the same question in present or past. If they have found each other, they discuss in pairs the differences. Your phone call has to include 8 to 10 questions. If you like you can make up some points in your phone call. The class has to find out if everything in your phone call is true.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">TASK OUTCOME</p> <p>Script and presentation of their phone call.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">PRESENTATION FORM</p> <p>Oral presentations in pairs / groups of three in front of the class. Not all presentations need to be presented within the same lesson, two to three could be listened to in each lesson.</p>
